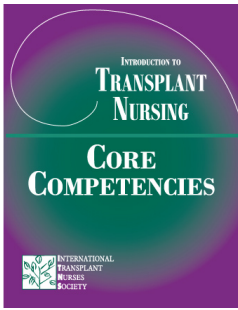


NEW! Transplant Nursing Core Competencies



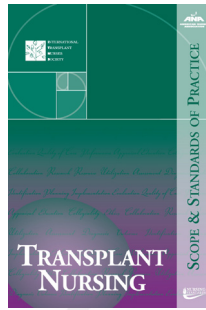
Competencies for nurses working in the area of transplantation are presented. Fifteen domains of practice are identified. Within each domain, competencies for the three

primary nursing roles (Transplant Nurse, Transplant Nurse Coordinator and Advanced Practice Transplant Nurse) are delineated.

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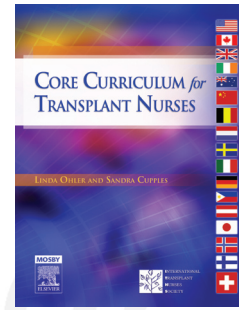
Transplant Nursing: Scope and Standards of Practice
